the titans

mates with RHEA, will be overthrown by ZEUS CRONUS

wife to CRONUS but will side with ZEUS RHEA

OCEANUS the seas

father of the sun, the moon, the dawn HYPERION

father of ATLAS (world-bearer) LAPETUS

PROMETHEUS (forethought, gives fire)

EPIMETHEUS (afterthought)

memory, mother (with ZEUS) of the MUSES: MNEMOSYNE

CLIO (history), URANIA (astronomy), MELPOMENE (tragedy), THALIA (comedy), TERPSICHORE (dance), CALLIOPE (epic poetry), ERATO (love poetry),

POLYHYMNIA (songs to gods), EUTERPE (lyric poetry)

the olympians

ZEUS (JUPITER) chief god, rules heavens, sky, rain

HERA (JUNO) sister and wife to ZEUS, goddess of marriage

POSEIDON (NEPTUNE) rules sea, gave horses

HADES (PLUTO) rules dead, precious metals, weds PERSEPHONE HESTIA (VESTA) goddess of hearth

ARES (MARS) god of war, affair with APHRODITE ATHENE (MINERVA) goddess of wisdom, cities, Athens; from ZEUS

APOLLO (APOLLO) god of light, truth, arrows, lyre, sun, Delphi APHRODITE (VENUS) goddess of love, beauty, from sea, weds HEPHAESTOS

HERMES (MERCURY) god of speed, thieves

ARTEMIS (DIANA) goddess of hunt, chastity, moon, deer

HEPHAESTOS (VULCAN) god of fire, armorers

Homeric heroes

husband of HELEN, king of Sparta MENELAOS

king of Argos, brother of MENELAOS, chief Greek leader AGAMEMNON

son of Peleus, king of Mymidons at Trojan war ACHILLES companion of ACHILLES, killed outside Troy PATROCLUS Greek leader in ILIAD, subject of ODYSSEY ODYSSEUS

AJAX Greek warrior in ILIAD

chief Trojans / Trojan war 1194-1184 (fall of Troy)

King of Troy PRIAM

wife of PRIAM, queen of Troy HECUBA

HECTOR son of PRIAM, chief Trojan warrior

ANDROMACHE wife of HECTOR

PARIS son of PRIAM, abducted HELEN to start Trojan war

CASSANDRA daughter of PRIAM, taken by AGAMEMNON
